Blockhouse Bay

About Manu Group Organisation at Blockhouse Bay

At Blockhouse Bay School nearly all Manu groups (classes) are organised in two-class flexible learning spaces. Teachers collaborate together to teach two 'Manu groups'. e.g. Takehē A&B. Classrooms are carefully set up and include spaces for different sizes of groups of children to meet, and work independently. Ways to manage noise, acoustics, flow of movement and storage of personal and class equipment are all planned carefully. Access to a Breakout space is also provided wherever possible.

What does a day look like?

Manu Groups or teams often start the day together and then move into smaller groups for Learning time. Throughout the day children are included in small group instructional lessons, independent learning and whole class lessons. There are more opportunities for small group teaching as one teacher may be teaching or supporting a large group enabling the other teacher to teach small groups. Both teachers monitor children's learning and document this regularly using Hero.

Safety at School Pick up Time

We know that school pick up is a very busy time and we want to make sure that it is as safe as possible. We have noticed some worrying and potentially dangerous situations both at the Pedestrian Crossing and in the Countdown carpark.

To keep everyone safe please:

Countdown

- Please meet your child at the walkway and walk your child to your car
- Ensure your children wear seat belts
- When exiting the car park, please do not turn right on to Donovan Street as this delay causes considerable build-up of traffic behind you. We recommend that people always turn left and then go around the roundabout if they need to go this way.

Pedestrian Crossing

- Wait for the patrollers to put the signs out and wait until they say "Cross now"
- Walk bikes across the crossing
- Please drop your child in a safe place- do not drop your child off at the stop sign or on the yellow lines


