Bringing Mobile Devices to School

Earlier in the year, the government mandated that children needed to hand in mobile devices to the office if they needed to bring them to school. We need to point out to parents that this means all devices that can be used to phone, text or take photos. Children who bring mobile phones or smart watches to school must hand them into the office and collect them at the end of the day.



TOYS AND COLLECTIBLE CARDS

There are many problems that can be caused when children bring toys and collectible cards to school including arguments over ownership and who is to blame if they get lost, stolen or broken. For these reasons, we ask that parents make every effort to ensure that these items are not brought to school. Please note that this includes Countdown Disney Cards.









Is your child in correct uniform?

We appreciate parents taking the time to make sure that the children are all in the correct school uniform and that all items have the family name in them. From time to time, we need to do reminders in the newsletter about this to make sure that everyone is aware of these rules:

Only black clothing can be worn under the uniform (no patterns)

All hair bankds, ties and clips are to be small and either white or black, no patters

Socks too are white or black with no patterns

Watches (not digital) and religious items can be worn

Plan black religious scarves may be worn

Please note too that all children will need to have a school hat to wear at school from the start of term four. If your child does not have one, now is the time to get these purchased so that they are ready to wear from the 17th October onwards.
