### Is the NZ Education System Really That Bad?

Answering this question can be a little difficult as it is all about how you measure it, but one universally accepted way is to use statistics from the Program for International Student Assessment (PISA). This is an international (over 80 countries) assessment that measures reading, mathematics and science literacy.

The 2022 results have New Zealand in 14th place when aggregating all three of Reading, Writing and Mathematics results. (although in reality, it is higher than this because the results have Macao and Hong Kong listed as countries whereas most people would probably argue that they are part of China).

Either way we are in at least 14th place out of 82 countries.

Should we be striving to be better, absolutely, but maybe people who are saying we are in really bad shape could be carrying out a bit of a fact check.

### ATTENDANCE AND PUNCUTALITY FOCUS

Over the last few years, both governments have increased the emphasis on children being at school if they are well enough to do so. Across the country, the number of children who are regularly absent is a real concern and this will be affecting their ability to gain qualifications and employment later in life. Absences also restrict children's ability to build friendships with other children who will learn to play with others if they are not at school regularly.

The Ministry of Education is now insisting that we let parents know that absences for reasons such as birthdays and trips away are classified as unjustified and that this information is recorded in the child's attendance records. Although we would be better than most schools, in term two this year, unjustified absences made up 10% of the reasons why children were away from Blockhouse Bay Primary, so this is a genuine issue.

We note too that last term, nearly 70% of absences were for medical/sick reasons and we totally support parents keeping children at home when they are unwell.

At the same time, the Ministry is asking schools to increase the emphasis on children arriving at school on time. In term two, over ¼ of our children were late to school at least once. Twenty-two individual children were late to school at least one day every week and another fifteen children were late at least twice a week. Having children arrive late is very disruptive for everyone and we strongly urge parents to organise for their child to be here on time.

Parents are likely to have heard about our latest initiative where children put a counter into a jar if they are here on time so that their Team might win a prize and this seems to be helping to get the children to school on time. Our long-term goal is for the children to see that getting to school on time (around 8.30am) allows them to interact with their friends and be more settled at the beginning of the day. It also helps the teacher who has begun their teaching and then has to adjust for children who are late.

Thank you for supporting your child to make the most of the learning time at school, when they are well enough to be here.
